
**MONTROSE TRUSTEE COUNCIL RESOLUTION REGARDING
Funding for the Montrose Settlements Restoration Program:
Cost Increases for Belmont Pier Project and
Bald Eagle Outreach Video**

1. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA); the State of California acting through the State Lands Commission, the Department of Parks & Recreation and the Department of Fish & Game; and the Department of the Interior, acting through the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and the National Park Service are the natural resource trustees (Trustees) for natural resources injured by releases of DDT and PCBs into the Southern California Bight.
2. Sums recovered in the civil action *United States, et al. v. Montrose Chemical Corp., et al.*, No. CV 90-3122-R (C.D. Cal. 1990) are being held in the Department of the Interior Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration Fund (DOI Restoration Fund).
3. The Trustees have entered into a memorandum of understanding (MOU), as modified, that establishes a Trustee Council (Montrose Trustee Council) composed of one voting member for each trustee agency. Under the terms of that MOU, the Montrose Trustee Council is authorized to disburse funds for activities related to the damage assessment and restoration process.
4. On December 9, 2008, in Trustee Council Resolution 09-1, the Montrose Trustee Council approved the program's 2009 budget, which included funding in the amount of \$50,000 for a bald eagle outreach video, \$270,000 for the design and permitting of the Belmont Pier artificial reef (including \$120,000 from the 2008 budget and \$150,000 from the 2009 budget), and \$100,517 for a contract with the Institute of Wildlife Studies to carry out the San Nicolas Island Restoration Project.
5. On the monthly Montrose Trustee Council call held on August 20, 2009, the Trustee Council Representatives discussed and verbally approved additional funding of \$17,000 for the bald eagle outreach video. This would allow the contractor to conduct another year of filming in order to capture footage of eagles in the Pelican Harbor nest (which failed in 2009). This increase brings the total approved for this contract to \$67,000.
6. On the August 20, 2009, Trustee Council call, the Trustee Council also discussed and verbally approved additional funding of \$207,790 for the Belmont Pier reef project design contract. This reflects a cost increase from the total approved in the 2009 Budget of \$270,000. This increase brings the total approved for

the Belmont Pier Reef Project design contract to \$477,790. The increase in costs is due to additional compliance and engineering work that was not identified in the original cost estimate.
